- 2. Council Roles and Opportunities to Get Involved, Jason. We are in need of a Treasurer. Kelly Sheppard has reviewed and cleaned up Financials and made it easy to take over.
- 3. Guest Speakers Getting Informed on Enrollment & Student Accommodation
  - Mr. Martin Poirier, Area 6 Director, Explanation of the School Support Model
    - Chief Superintendent, Superintendents of School Improvements, Schools and Area Offices (we are Area 6), Service Units.
    - Schools are the most important part of this Model
  - Mr. Dany Breton, Superintendent of CBE Facilities & Environmental Services
    - o Our Objective is to increase enrollment, and keep Chinook Park School open.
    - Government sets out clear parameters in wich we can operate
      - Funding is directly linked to enrolment/utilization rate
      - Once schools dip below 85% utilization rate, Operations and maintenance Budget is greatly reduced

- Use the RAM (Resource Allocation Method) to guide funding
- Student Accommodation Plan
  - 10 year plan Looking at long term trends in the city
    - People are having fewer kids, lots of growth in outskirt communities - shift in population. Chinook Park demographic is maturing, so enrollment is down
    - Looking at options such as boundary changes, bussing to increase enrollment
  - 3 year plan Looks specifically at schools with a 70% or less, utilization rate
    - CPS was at 53% last year, 58% this year
    - Based on projections, we will estimate a drop again to about 55%
    - Implementation of options to help course correct/increase utilization
      - Community Involvement
  - 'Immediate' School Closure
    - Recommendation from Superintendent of closure to the Board of Trustees
    - Public Board Meeting to hear input, and Trustees decide if they will consider the school for closure
    - If yes, 60 day process Trustees provide information and background and an opportunity for input
    - January Discussions with Community
    - Spring 2022 Recommendation for closure
    - o Fall 2022 Decision to close
    - June 2023 Closure

  - Jacqueline Grobowski What are the ways you are looking at to increase utilization, beyond student enrollment.
    - Student Enrollment is the number one way to ensure closures don't happen.
    - Work with the City in the Joint Use Coordinating Committee (JUCC)
  - Medeana Moussa How do we ensure communities/schools aren't being pitted against each other ie: Haysboro and Chinook Park
    - We ensure that these things don't come down to community votes rather left up to Trustees
  - Katie McCurdy How many years has CPS been below 85%?
    - 2017/18 school year 67%
    - 2016/17 school year 68%
  - Katie McCurdy What are your considerations for closing a school?
    - Condition of the property
    - Long term projections
    - Level of demand for certain programs in the area
